

West Cheshire AC celebrated a memorable double success story in the opening round of two track and field league campaigns.

The Chester and Ellesmere Port-based club's seniors won their Northern League Division Two West first round match at Stanney Oaks by a winning margin of more than 100 points.

And West Cheshire AC's youngsters then grabbed glory 24 hours later in their National Young Athletes League Northern Premier Division match at Wigan's Robin Park Stadium.

Amy Williams grabbed a hat-trick of victories in West Cheshire AC youngsters' opening round win at Wigan.

The talented under 13 all-rounder posted 11.4 in her 70m hurdles, won her 150m in 19.9, and long jumped 4.62m.

She was supported by Charlotte Williamson who posted 4.11m for second spot in the B long jump, Georgia Barlow (10.7 in 75m), Olivia Williams (11.5 in 75m), Emily Ball (first in high jump with 1-25m, and first in shot with 7.09m), Megan McEveley (4:36.3 in 1200m), Sophie Carter (3:12.4 in 800m), and Natasha Tudor (2:48.2 in 800m).

The relay team of Ball, Barlow, Williamson, and Williams clinched first position.

Olivia Montez-Brown, Laura Rigby, Kelly Baker, and Lucy Earl secured victories from under 15 girls events.

Olivia (11.7 in 75, hurdles), Laura (12.8 in 100m), Kelly (9.76m in shot), and Lucy (20.14m in discus), were backed up by Sophie Percival (6.14m in shot), Chloe Hunt (2:52.1 in 800m), Ellen McMahon (5:57.3 in 1500m), and Sally Pickering (2:53.4 in 800m).

Montez-Brown, Baker, Earl, and Rigby combined to earn their club victory in the 4x100m relay. Torz Anderson claimed a hat-trick of wins in the under 17 ladies competition, with 4.95m in the long jump, 7.73m in the shot, and 1-50m in the high jump.

She was joined by Alice Jennings (12.5 in the 80m hurdles), Leah Ferrie (27.0 in the 200m), Danielle Erskine (20.86m in the javelin), Gemma Hale (1-70m in the pole vault), Emma Johnson (16.90m in the javelin), Jenna Sheehy (2:45.6 in the 800m), Jenni Potter (6.25m in the shot), and Ali Burkett (27.1 in the 200m).

Sheehy, Burkett, Ferrie, and Erskine combined for victory in the 4x100m relay, and Ferrie then joined Jennings, Anderson and Hale for success in the 4x400m relay.

Matt Pagan (4.05m long jump), Daniel Vickers (15.8 in 75m hurdles), James McMahon (1-33m high jump), Elijah Montez-Brown (2:50.2 in 800m), Jack Johnson (2:57.2 in 800m), and Cameron Weaver (6:09.3 in 1500m) after travelling from Abersoch to compete, represented the under 13 boys.

Montez-Brown, Vickers, McMahon, and Pagan combined for success in the 4x100m relay.

Tom Kellett (36.79m hammer), Yousef Khalifa (28.01m discus), Callum Wall (2:20 in 800m), Cameron Clark (36.38m javelin), Leon Langmead (2:40 in 800m), Chris McCartney (1-25m high jump), and Alex Kirk (1-40m high jump) scored points for the under 15 boys, with Clark, Khalifa, Wall, and Kellett finishing second in the 4x100m relay.

Stephen Jones (11.4 in 100m, and 5.67m long jump), Jordan Knox (11.6 in 100m and 5.84m in long jump), David Donkin (55.8 in 400m), Michael Bailiff (1-65m high jump), Ryan Jones (1-35m high jump), and Richard Farley (4:46.1 in 1500m) combined for the under 17s who grabbed glory in the 4x100m relay courtesy of Donkin, Knox, Farley, and Jones.
